Background

- While much progress has been made to date, progress towards meeting MDG4 and MDG5 is insufficient in many countries in Asia/Pacific.
- HOW to implement and scale up known essential RMNCH interventions is a challenge.
- A high level policy dialogue to learn from country experiences.

- Outcome document with agreed actions to strengthen regional cooperation to support countries in Asia and the Pacific to accelerate progress for women's and children's health.
- Strategy to follow up action in selected countries.
