Purpose and context

- Board requested an annually updated workplan to reflect RMNCH developments and ensure Partnership's relevance and value add
- Proposed 2013 workplan aims to enable the Partnership to capitalize on opportunities in the year ahead, and builds on lessons to date
- Purpose of the outline workplan is to inform Board discussion on:
 - Activities to be undertaken within the Partnership in 2013
 - Areas of work that the Partnership **should not engage in**, given the available time resources and the value add of the Partnership



Project based approach

- Based on experience, the most effective way for the Partnership to operate is through:
 - providing a <u>multi-constituency platform</u> for Partners to engage and align strategic direction for women's and children's health
 - engaging Partners in well defined projects, where working in Partnership achieves greater results than working individually
- Moving forward therefore it is proposed that there is a more of a "projectized" way of working



Strategic Objectives and Outputs

- 2012 workplan organized along the lines of three Strategic Objectives (and Core Functions) including:
 - SO I: Broker knowledge and innovation for action
 - SO 2: Advocate for mobilizing and aligning resources and for greater engagement
 - SO 3: Promote accountability for results
- Work under each of the SOs and Core Functions will be organized into four project driven Outputs
- Each Output would be achieved through implementation of a number of SO and Core Function projects reflecting the cross-cutting nature of the work



Proposed outputs

- Output 1: Position goals for women's and children's health in national, regional and global agendas, including the post-2015 development framework
- Output 2: Accelerate national, regional and global collective action to implement essential interventions and innovations for women's and children's health
- Output 3: Promote mutual accountability for women's and children's health
- Output 4: Engage stakeholders to implement PMNCH workplan towards improving women's and children's health



Implementing the workplan

- Partner Centric approach is essential to implementing this workplan
- Projects have transparent and measurable resource requirements:
 - human resources required to plan, implement and monitor projects as FTEs (from Partners, Secretariat and/ or commissioned experts)
 - FTEs committed by Partners (e.g. secondments) formally identified and measurable, and reported to Finance Committee as in-kind contributions
 - financial resources required to pay for commissioned experts and costs of running the Partnership
- Total financial resources budget proposed to be US\$ 12 million
- Partners have the responsibility for implementation of projects, being mutually accountable for the workplan's overall completion
