

Invisible stillbirths: (PA5, PA1)







- PMNCH Portal: born, needs care and feeding (Cross-cutting)





- Seeks to complement Commission & G8 Accountability Report
- Data collection & analysis underway
- Planned release at time of UN General Assembly in September 2011





III.Tracking Commitments (ii)

Countdown to 2015

- Technical work underway
 - Tracking of Countdown indicators
 - Cross-cutting research on coverage, equity, financing and policies/health systems underway
- Next Countdown report and conference in 2012
- Countdown critical to implementation of Commission's recommendations
 - Global reporting on progress
 - Use of data to inform national policymaking
- Opportunities to optimize promoting Countdown data through PMNCH - advocacy events, portal and regional networks





IV. Management and finance (i)

- Outstanding 2011 Workplan budget requirement is
 \$317,000 (excluding the 2010 US\$ 500,000 cash flow shortfall)
- Cash flow affects workplan delivery.
 - Need for greater funding flexibility (where possible)
 - o Flexibility on use of funds within the workplan
 - o Flexibility on when funds are used within the workplan
- Secretariat workload and resource implications of decisions
 - Decision making processes should take into account the workload implications for a small Secretariat





IV. Management and finance (ii)

- Donors are responsive, resource mobilisation (largely) on track (we hope!), unspecified funding helpful. Note the qualifying cautious language.....
- Robust management and financial systems, linked with WHO, and advised by Finance Committee
- Contracting procedures in line with best practice.





V. Governance (i)

Board:

- Retreat, Board in June
- Board rotation and changes (nominations, elections)

Committees of the Board:

- Monthly EC calls
- Finance Committee calls (previous to Board Meetings)

Keeping the information flowing:

- Communication to the Board (messages)— communication to the wider membership (e-newsletters)
- Governance on the web Board pages, governance calendar, new "financials" page.





V. Governance (ii)

Membership - managing growing number of applications

- New Interactive Database
- Regular updates /survey and requests for updated information

Support to the constituencies:

- Donors & Foundations (monthly) strategy, commitments and engagement in activities and opportunities
- NGO: biggest constituency exercise underway to map constituency and improve engagement
- Support to EC members and their constituencies on membership wide consultations (through the web)

Growing requests and additional requirements has resource implications

3. Evolving to a Strategic Framework for 2012-2015

Vision: The achievement of the MDGs, with women and children enabled to realize their right to the highest attainable standard of health

Mission: Supporting Partners to align their strategic directions and catalyse collective action to achieve universal access to agreed essential interventions for women's and children's health

SOI: Broker knowledge and innovation for action

SO2: Promote accountability for results

SO3: Advocate for mobilising and aligning resources and for greater engagement
