Objectives

The PMNCH 14-15 July 2022 Board meeting takes place at an increasingly fragile time for women, children, and adolescents. The combination of COVID-19, climate change, and growing conflicts around the world has interrupted progress in sustainable development, with consequences to be felt for generations to come. We also see pronounced shifts towards far right-wing and conservative politics are threatening hard-won progress in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR). This is happening globally, regionally, nationally and locally, affecting progress in many areas. SRHR related decisions are being made in the corridors of power in one part of the world which are reverberating across the globe, with very real implications for the lives and health of individuals in other parts of the world. The impacts of politics on SRHR are often the greatest for the most vulnerable or marginalised populations, who themselves may have limited opportunities to influence political outcomes on their own behalf.

Protecting the 2030 SDG agenda requires a robust effort by all PMNCH #PartnersForChange to align behind country leadership in mobilizing for policy, financing and service delivery commitments to protect the most vulnerable.

This Board meeting will focus discussion on four strategic opportunities for country-led action, supported by all PMNCH constituencies:

- Securing greater women's, children's and adolescents' (WCA) health and well-being national, regional and global commitments, especially in times of COVID, conflict, and climate change.
- Upholding Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights.
- Galvanizing a global movement for adolescent well-being.
- Maintaining momentum on maternal, newborn and child health.

The Board meeting will be chaired by the Rt Hon Helen Clark.
