### ITEM 1 – Adoption of the Agenda and Note for the Record from previous meeting

### **Introduction from the Chair**

• On behalf of the Executive Committee (EC), the EC Chair thanked all those involved in preparing the focused agenda for this meeting, and for all the supporting papers that were shared in advance through PMNCH's website.

### ITEM 2a - Refining PMNCH's approach to WCA commitment mobilization and accountability

- Helga Fogstad (in lieu of a PECC representative) shared a <u>presentation</u> based on the EC background paper: 'PMNCH advocacy and accountability for commitments to Women's, Children's and Adolescents' health and wellbeing: A Refined Approach'.
- The presentation highlighted the proposed refinements to the principles and approaches of PMNCH's advocacy and accountability for commitments in women's, children's and adolescents' health and well-being.
- The presentation was well-received, with members of the EC noting the following points:
  - The scoping exercise to identify existing commitments across the possible 30 priority countries could be very time and resource intensive. It will therefore be important to 'dock into' processes already underway and leverage mechanisms already in place (e.g., GFF), as well as ensure that adequate resources are available to complete this important piece of work. To support this effort, lead/ coordination partners in countries need to be identified quickly so as to enable constituencies to use these focal points to leverage their in-country networks.
  - Stakeholders involved in these processes need to be drawn from a broad range of sectors, including, for example, the private sector and adolescents and youth-led organizations, as all constituencies will have a key role to play in ensuring accountability for the delivery of existing commitments.
  - It is important to define what is a "quality" commitment, as well as a standardized core set
    of definitions to enable global and national comparisons to be made across commitments.
     This may call for a focus on a smaller number of commitment 'classes', which may focus
    on, for example, include financing, healthcare workforce, etc.
  - Care is needed to avoid this effort being overshadowed by too much process, which could cloud the vision for why this is being undertaken. Efforts therefore need to be streamlined to ensure a focus on results.



• It was suggested that the existing Partner Engagement Strategy could be supported by additional resources that would reflect these important commitment-related refinements.

# ITEM 2b - PMNCH Standing Committees and Working Groups Response to country commitment approach, including updates on workplan deliverables

- Githinji Githahi (Co-Chair of Strategic Advocacy Committee), Jonathan Klein (Vice-Chair of Accountability Working Group) and Mark Hanson (Chair of Knowledge and Evidence Working Group) shared a <u>presentation</u> summarizing their respective structures' response and reflections to the proposed refined approach to advocacy and accountability for WCAH commitments.
- In doing so, they reflected on how this updated approach will be put into action through the PMNCH workplan deliverables that they are overseeing.

Issues to be addressed, but not limited to, include:  • selecting the 30 focus countries and identifying ways of leveraging and docking into existing in-country coordination mechanisms;  • selecting and identifying in-country lead/ coordination partner(s), and devising creative and innovative ways to encourage, inspire and resource in-country partners to engage in leading these efforts;  • leveraging existing platforms and PMNCH constituencies' networks in countries or regionally making the commitment process engagement-friendly for all constituencies (e.g., enabling youth and adolescents, NGOs, and other more resource constrained constituencies to engage);  • standardizing and defining "quality" with respect to commitments, enabling greater clarity on methods and approaches, e.g., establishing a core set of commitments to follow up and compare progress across countries;  • assessing the needed resources for operationalizing this strategy. 2.3	Asked PECC to report to the EC with further implementation details, including proposals and greater clarity on:  • nature and definitions of commitments (e.g., focus on a few types of commitments to support comparability, setting a 'high-bar' for what constitutes a commitment to avoid proliferation of low quality commitments, etc.)	PECC to present at next EC meeting

2.4	Requested for any scoping work on existing commitments to be done in a light-touch and efficient manner, using existing information and processes, conscious of the possible high resource-intensity of any such process being started afresh. ### ITEM 5 – Proposed Agenda for PMNCH Board Meeting on 29-30 November 2022

- Rajesh Bhushan shared the <u>proposed agenda</u> for the two-day PMNCH Board meeting, scheduled to take place on 29 and 30 November 2022.
- In the presentation, he noted that it is proposed for the first part of Day 1 to be dedicated to a
  high-level strategic discussion on the role of the Global Leaders Network in accelerating the
  implementation of existing commitments to improving the health and wellbeing of women,
  children and adolescents.
- The second part of Day 1 is proposed to discuss how existing accountability mechanisms can be
  used to strengthen the implementation of commitments to WCA. It is expected that the progress
  report 'Protect the Promise' will be presented and the Principals of UNICEF and UNFPA, and the
  Director General of WHO, will be invited to participate in a discussion on this.
- Day Two will begin by building on the discussion from Day One. In particular, it will focus on the role of Private Sector engagement in commitment implementation and mobilization. It is proposed that the remaining part of Day 2 will focus on operational aspects, such as report backs from the Executive Committee and the Governance and Ethics Committee.
