Objectives of PMNCH Board Meeting

The 31st PMNCH Board meeting will focus on the following strategic opportunities for supporting country-led action towards improving women's, children's and adolescents' (WCA) health and well-being:

- Engaging with the **G20** and **G7** platforms to strengthen leadership and policy action for women, children and adolescents;
- Financing and policy opportunities to address the impact of climate change on women's, children's and adolescents' health and well-being;
- Leveraging the **Global Forum for Adolescents** on 11-12 October 2023 to increase commitment to adolescent well-being, and to raise visibility for the needs and priorities of young people themselves through the **1.8 campaign**;
- Strengthening **partner alignment at country level** to drive implementation of commitments, including through high-level leadership and bottom-up community action.

ITEM 3 – Engaging with the G20 and G7 to improve women's, children's and adolescents' health and well-being

11:30 – 13:00 ITEM 3A - The G20 and Women's, Children's and Adolescents' Health: *One Earth, One Family, One Future*

Objectives: The 18th G20 Heads of State and Government Summit will take place on 9-10 September 2023 in New Delhi, India. To inform G20 member-states about current needs and opportunities for health and well-being, PMNCH has been invited by the official engagement group of the G20 – the T20 (Think Twenty) -- to produce a brief on the priorities for women, children and adolescents for G20 delivery of concrete policy and financing measures. This policy brief complements the laser-like focus on the needs of adolescents and youth, as discussed at the pre-Board G20 meeting on 21 June. This Board discussion will focus on how PMNCH members can support G20 leaders in taking forward the measures outlined in the brief through an inclusive, far-reaching multi-stakeholder effort.

Decision: To agree on how PMNCH can best support the G20 India presidency and G20 members in ensuring appropriate recognition and support for the urgent needs of women, children and adolescents within the main negotiation tracks of the G20 summit in 2023, as well as strengthening the position of these issues ahead of the 2024 G20 summit in Brazil.

Objectives: PMNCH has a highly successful history of engaging with G7 member-states to advocate for increased financing and policy measures for women's, children's and adolescents' health. In 2010, new MNCH financing commitments at the G7 Muskoka Summit in Canada helped support the implementation of the UN Secretary-General's Every Woman Every Child strategy, advancing the Millennium Development Goals. In the Sustainable Development Goal era, growing attention to gender equity and the role of sexual and gender-based violence, including with respect to advancing SRHR, were recognized by the leaders of 2021 UK-hosted summit in Carbis Bay and the 2022 German summit at Elmae Schloss. Building on this legacy, PMNCH members have advocated strenuously for greater attention to SRHR in the context of UHC – a primary concern of the Japanese presidency of the 2023 Summit in Hiroshima, 19-21 May. This strategic discussion at the PMMCH Board will review G7 leadership and other key ministerial commitments, including Foreign Ministers and Health Ministers in 2023 to agree on support for implementation, as well as priorities for ongoing advocacy in 2024 under the G7's incoming Italian presidency.

Decision: Building on recent G7 leadership commitments, agree on how PMNCH can develop a multi-year influencing agendas for both the G7 and for the international financing institutions to maximize their impact on SRHR, as well as MNCH and adolescent well-being. Agree on how the Japanese G7 support for SRHR in UHC can be leveraged to increase visibility for SRHR, MNCH and Adolescent Well-Being issues within the outcomes of the UN High Level Meeting on UHC in September 2023 in New York.

Objective: To implement existing country commitments for women's, children's and adolescents' health, PMNCH will support partners in analyzing current progress and gaps against agreed indicators, and formulating country advocacy action plans. This agenda item will update on progress and agree strategic approaches to advance this effort, including through high-level champions (e.g., Global Leaders Network; parliamentarians), grassroots organizations and processes (e.g., citizen hearings), the aligned efforts of PMNCH constituencies, and media/social media efforts. Digital Advocacy Hubs will unite partner efforts in 10 prioritized countries in 2023, complementing the work of existing multi-stakeholder platforms. This discussion among PMNCH Board members will guide these efforts by identifying opportunities for leveraging national and regional platforms for action, and building on the target-setting and/or commitment-making efforts of key global partnerships such as FP2030, Generation Equality, ENAP-EPMM, and the Global Financing Facility.
