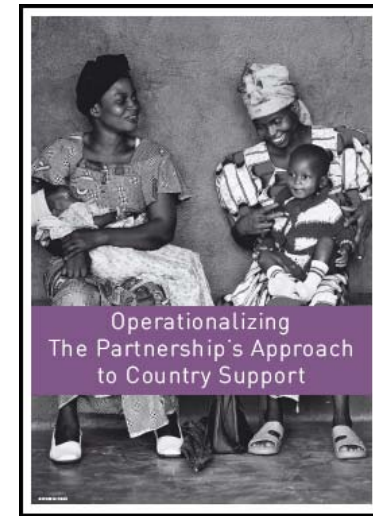

Country Support

- "Operationalizing the Partnership's Approach to Country Support", written by members of the Country Support Working Group and the Secretariat
- On-going mapping of partner activities and technical support capacity
- Meetings with 17 Ministers of Health (or delegates) during World Health Assembly 2007



Country Support

- Nigeria
 - TA to develop integrated MNCH strategic plan and launch of National PMNCH
 - PMNCH high-level advocacy visit in Sept 2007, which led to Government decision to allocate more of debt-relief funds to MNCH
 - Review proposal for support from PMNCH Grant from Gates Foundation (roll-out of MNCH plan and Advocacy at state and local level, and support to National PMNCH)



The Partnership's visit to Suleja General Hospital, Minna, Nigeria.



Country Support

- Ethiopia
 - Joint PMNCH and GAVI visit in May 2007
 - PMNCH participated in Health Sector Review in October 2007
 - Review proposal for support from PMNCH Grant (currently under finalization by the country)
- DRC
 - High-level contacts developed, waiting for MOH feedback on visit



Country Support

- Tanzania
 - PMNCH facilitated the National Technical Consultation on MNCH in April 2007
 - TA to develop integrated MNCH plan (PMNCH and local partners) November mission by co-chair and small team
- Burkina Faso, Malawi, Mozambique
 - PMNCH participated in joint missions in Feb-March 2007 to initiate the process of rapid scale-up of MNCH interventions as part of the PMNCH Grant
 - Burkina Faso and Mozambique have submitted proposals PMNCH Grant implementation

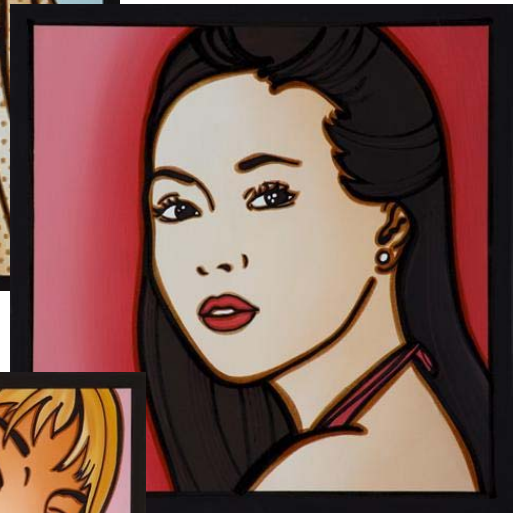
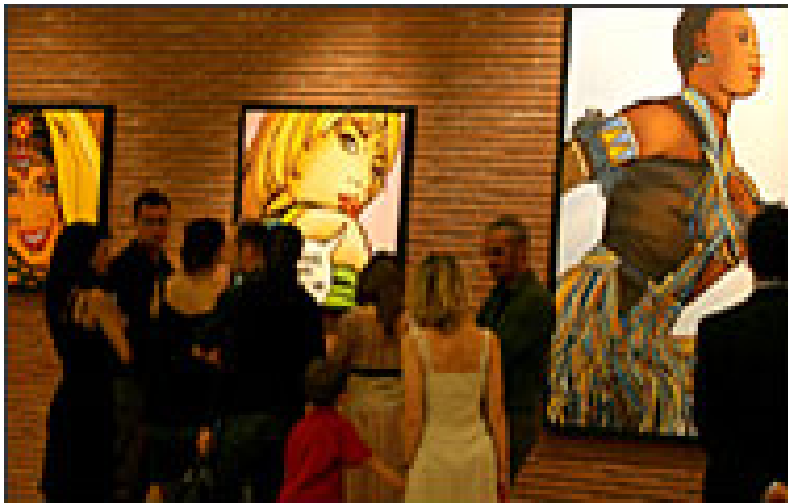


- Almost 2,000 participants from 109 countries
- Ministers' Forum
- Financial and political commitments announced
- PMNCH booth well-attended
- Prior to event, PMNCH Director participated in UK Parliamentary Inquiry on Maternal Health

New funds to MNCH (all figures in USD)

- Global Campaign
 - 1 billion from Norway (MDGs 4 and 5) over 10 years
 - 180 million from Netherlands (MDGs 3 and 5)
- Catalytic Initiative
 - 105 million from Canada over 5 years
- Announcement at Women Deliver
 - 200 million from UK to UNFPA
 - 11 million from MacArthur Foundation
 - Global health on agenda of G8 in Japan 2008

More still needed to reach estimated needs to scale up coverage of MNCH 2006-2015:

Aligning Partners and Increasing Aid Effectiveness

- PMNCH contributed to defining scope of Asia-Pacific Investment Case for MNCH
- Regional Health Care Professional Associations' workshop in Blantyre, Malawi (see next slide)
- Electronic communities established
- Website enhanced in interaction





Aligning Partners and Increasing Aid Effectiveness



- **Health Care Professional Associations' workshop in Blantyre, Malawi**
- Objective
 - Increase the contribution of HCPAs to national MNCH plans
- Participants
 - 56 HCP and public sector representatives from Ethiopia, Malawi, Nigeria, Tanzania and Uganda
 - Representatives of international and regional organizations
- Format
 - Presentations, panel discussions and group work in five areas: advocacy, quality improvement, human resources, planning and organizational strengthening
- Outputs
 - Identification of problem areas
 - Development of 1-2 year action plan by HCPAs
 - Creation of country level HCPAs collaboration
 - Declaration of HCPA's commitment



Monitoring and Accountability, Governance

- Countdown to 2015: support to planning of 2008 event and report
- Board and Partnership infrastructure established
- Formal establishment of Working Groups and elections of Chairs
- Total number of PMNCH members **218**
almost three fold increase
(at PMNCH launch **80**)



First Partners' Forum Tanzania, 17-20 April 2007



- Wide range of stakeholders attended, incl. Tanzania PM and MOH, President of Pan African Parliament
- Significant media coverage in Tanzania

What was not achieved and why?

- Country Support: engagement in Cambodia and Pakistan, and one country in Latin America
- MNCH Framework in Asia
- Full functioning of the four Working Groups
- Full recruitment of staff according to organigram

INSUFFICIENT PEOPLE AND TIME



Lessons Learnt from 2007 Work plan implementation

- Slow recruitment of fixed term positions (recently an accelerated process in place)
- Unexpected vacancies and other leave
- Resource mobilization achieved, but at cost. Few donors supported with unspecified contribution towards the work plan
- Further alignment with processes of the host organization needed: for example the WHO work plan process is biennial and this year was earlier than the PMNCH process



Conclusions

- The PMNCH is starting to walk, but it is not YET running
- The Secretariat is prepared to do its utmost to respond to the strategic directions that the Board will set
