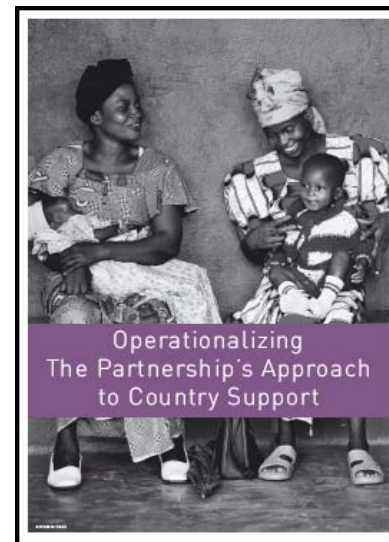
Why do we need to consider how to position PMNCH in the new global health environment?

- Ensure that the partnership's strengths and activities are recognized and incorporated into new international health initiatives
- Ensure that new initiatives include a strong focus on MDGs 4 & 5 and on key MNCH interventions and outcomes
- Contribute to implementation of new initiatives by providing PMNCH's own experience as a partnership



Where do we start?

- Agree on principles for involvement with international initiatives
- Translate principles into an approach
- Build on key PMNCH documents and analysis of new initiatives



How did the international health arena change recently?

- Global Campaign for the Health MDGs:
 - International Health Partnership
 - Catalytic Initiative to Save a Million Lives
 - Network of Global Leaders
 - Results-based Financing
 - Providing for Health Initiative
 - Deliver Now for Women and Children
 - Women Deliver





- Launched on 26 Sep 2007 in New York
- Advocacy drive to:
 - Strengthen civic activism to increase demand for services
 - Identify gaps
 - Hold political leaders accountable
- Coordinated by PMNCH



Women Deliver Conference

- London, October 18-20, 2007
- Almost 2,000 participants from 109 countries
- Key messages from closing statement
 - Must recognize and build on synergies between health and other sectors
 - Consensus on 3 pillars for saving lives of women and newborns: comprehensive RH services, skilled care, emergency care
 - Significant new resources are needed
- Proposed follow-up:
 - Special session at UN General Assembly?
 - New fund for women and newborn?
 - Follow-up conference in 2009?



New funds to MNCH (all figures in USD)

- Global Campaign
 - 1 billion from Norway (MDGs 4 and 5) over 10 years
 - 180 million from Netherlands (MDGs 3 and 5)
- Catalytic Initiative
 - 105 million from Canada over 5 years
- Announcement at Women Deliver
 - 200 million from UK to UNFPA
 - 11 million from MacArthur Foundation
 - Global health on agenda of G8 in Japan 2008

More still needed to reach estimated needs to scale up coverage of MNCH 2006-2015:

10 billion USD per year (Source: WHO)
