# Issues to be addressed in the context of Renewal

of

## Memorandum of Understanding between PMNCH and WHO

**Preamble** (p 1) - edit to bring language up to date.

### Part A - The Partnership (p 2)

- **Revise Priority** Outcomes should reflect decisions of Retreat: advocacy, harmonization and accountability (para 1.1)
- **Revise Priority -** Use updated language, Board not Steering Committee; task forces not working groups (para 1.2 and elsewhere)
- **Drop Priority** Reference to global conference not relevant. (para 1.3)

Note - This is mostly editing to bring the language up to date. For consideration: equivalent section of the Health Metrics Network MOU provides functions (of Board, Secretariat, advisory groups).

#### Part B - The Secretariat (begins p 3)

- Add Priority, may require consultation Placement of the Secretariat within WHO there may be benefits to being "attached" to the Cluster on Partnerships and UN Reform, rather than the FCH Cluster. This would bring the advantage of separating what is now a dual role fulfilled by FCH: oversight and full Board membership. Board membership might remain with FCH, while administrative oversight might be taken up by Partnerships Cluster.
- Add/Specify Priority, may require consultation A more precise "delegation of authority from the Director-General of WHO" rather than "appropriate".

Note - see para 8.4.2 in GHWA MOU.

**Revise** - **Priority** - Secretariat functions to be revised based on decision taken on outputs and activities at November Board meeting. (para 4)

Note - This is editing only to bring language up to date.

Add/Specify - Priority, may require consultation - List concretely alternative procedures that the Secretariat would follow in the areas of: a) recruitment of staff - role of Board member on panel and job descriptions are two issues here; b) publications and clearance of by WHO; c) use of logo and imagery. (para 5)

Note - Recruitment of Director and Staff are treated separately and clearly in Roll Bank Malaria's MOU, in the main body (see p 5). UNITAID's MOU includes a detailed Annex addressing recruitment of the Director (see p 13). Communications, intellectual property, branding and copyright are dealt with in UNITAID (see p 9) and GHWFA (see p 12-13) MOUs.

• Add - Priority - A reference to the new 3-year strategic framework would be helpful here (para 5).

Note - Editing only.

Add - High priority - Interest on grants should accrue to the Partnership, not to WHO. This was the case until Jan 1, 08 when a new WHO policy was brought in; other MOUs had protective language about this. (section on Finance Matters, p 5)

Note - the UNITAID MOU contains explicit language, see p 6, para 5.4.

**Remove** - **Priority** - References to predecessor partnerships is probably obsolete and can be removed (para 13)

Note - Editing only.

Add - High priority, may require consultation - Specific program support cost percentages, and what these apply to (para 14); also, refer to the Partnership's budget being outside the ceiling estimates for any one WHO cluster (section on Finance Matters, starting p 5).

Note - Current agreement on reduced program support costs (on activities vs salaries) is being questioned, per outcomes of recent EB discussions. Recently, Stop TB negotiated 7% across the board. See Annex B of UNITAID's MOU for detailed fee structure. No other MOU (to Secretariat's knowledge) has reference to ceiling issue.
