Digital Advocacy Hubs



Overall Objective: Digital Advocacy Hubs to equip and enable PMNCH partners to advocate more powerfully together

Vision: The world's most powerful digital advocacy platform for women's, children's, & adolescents' health.

Mission: To harness the power of digital technology for connecting PMNCH partners in mobilizing financing, policy, and service delivery commitments for women's, children's, and adolescents' health.



Digital Advocacy Hubs: What will they achieve?

PMNCH partners engage more effectively and widely to implement WCAH projects, activities and events

Knowledge Synthesis: ACCESS

Hubs provide access to, and exchange of, WCAH knowledge resources, including knowledge summaries, papers, case studies, reports, toolkits, videos, podcasts, etc.

Partner Engagement: NETWORKS

Hubs foster greater skills, capacities, and networks by supporting new coalitions and providing advocacy training, skill-building, and “how-to” courses and workshops

Campaigns and Outreach: ACTION

Hubs connect & engage members and partners in joint campaign activities and events, for example, to support the 2023 Global Forum for Adolescents
