Vision of the Global Strategy 2.0

“By 2030, a world in which every woman, child and adolescent in every setting realizes their rights to physical and mental health and well-being, has social and economic opportunities, and is fully able to participate in shaping prosperous and sustainable societies”

- National leadership of action in countries is key



Operational Framework (OF)

- **Why?**

- Accompanies GS 2.0
- Resource for all countries on how to strengthen action at country level
- Options for translating SDG targets and GS 2.0 action areas into existing and new country-led plans for implementation

- **Who for?**

- National governments
- Civil society, private sector, development partners within countries
- Clarify roles of global and regional actors



Process of development

- Builds on extensive GS 2.0 consultations
- Specific consultations on OF
 - Tanzania, August 2015
 - India, August 2015
 - General Assembly, New York, Sept 2015
 - Mexico, Oct 2015
 - Zambia, Oct 2015
 - Uganda, Oct 2015
 - Fiji, Oct 2015

Content of Operational Framework

- “Ingredients for action” aligned to GS 2.0 action areas
- Country examples
 - E.g. country leadership – “Saving Million Lives” in Nigeria
 - E.g. multisectoral action – “Chile Crece Contigo” in Chile
- Links to detailed guidance
- Milestones for impact of GS 2.0 itself
- OF will exist as a document and on EWEC website as a resource centre that can be updated

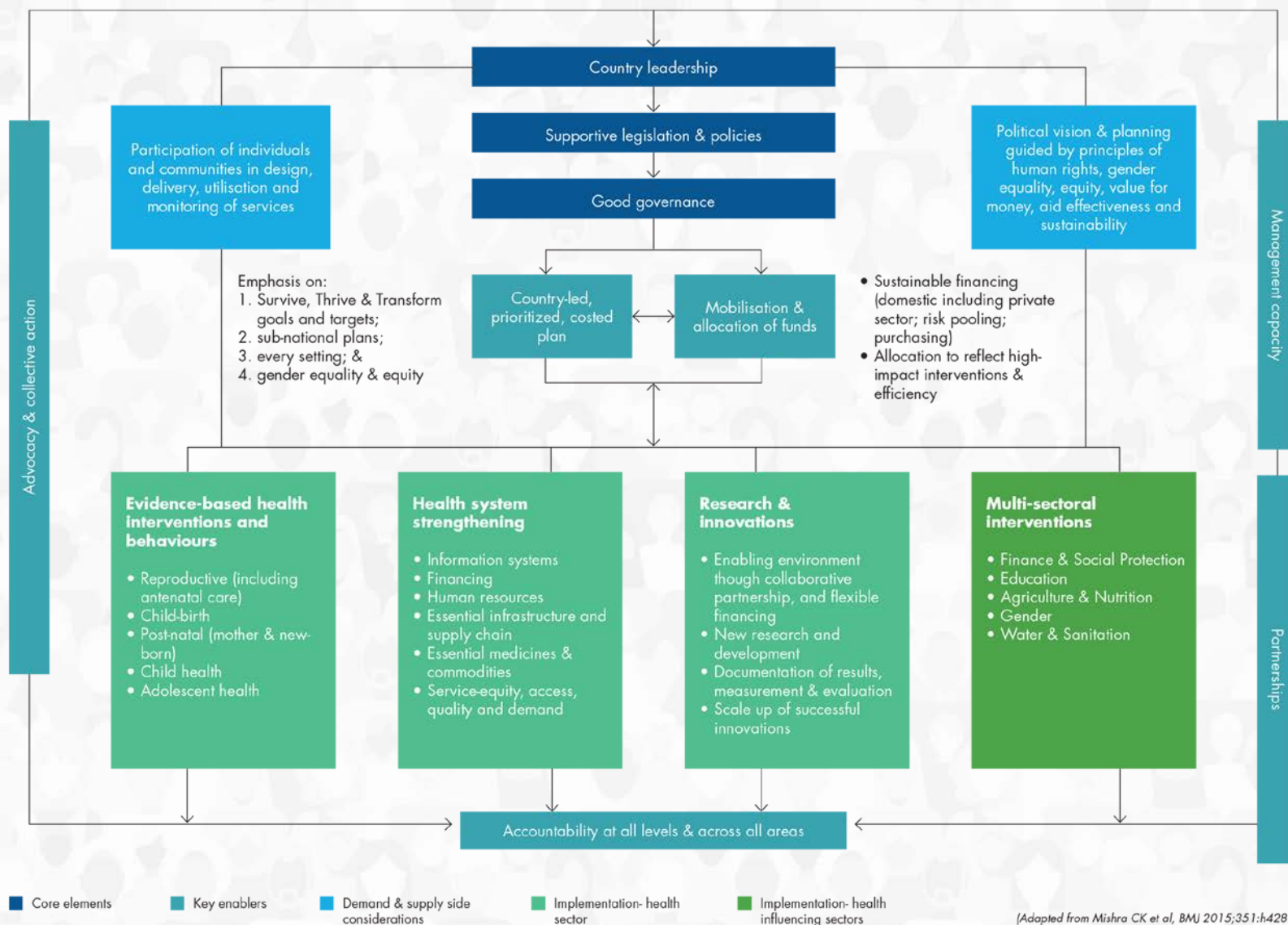


Nine ingredients for action

1. Facilitating country leadership
2. Aligning and mobilizing financing
3. Supporting community engagement, participation & advocacy
4. Reinforcing global and national accountability mechanisms
5. Strengthening health systems
6. Enhancing mechanisms for multisectoral action
7. Establishing priorities for adolescent health programmes and early child development
8. Prioritizing humanitarian settings
9. Fostering research and innovation
