

## HIGH-LEVEL EVENT ON THE OCCASION OF THE UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2024 (UNGA79) AND SUMMIT OF THE FUTURE

Securing the health of every woman, child, and adolescent: Political leadership to achieve the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals

Based on current trends, most countries will fail to reach 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) targets for improving women's, children's and adolescents' health. Alarmingly, 46 countries are off-track in meeting the SDG target for maternal mortality, and 59 countries are off-track in meeting the under-5 child mortality SDG target. To galvanize progress, political leadership at the highest level is required urgently for investment, partnerships and policies to deliver quality and affordable primary care for all.

As Heads of State and Government gather during the 79th United Nations General Assembly at the Summit for the Future, this event led by HE President Cyril Ramaphosa of South Africa will take stock of key challenges and financing opportunities based on latest investment case evidence, to accelerate action in the final five years to the 2030 goals. As chair of the Global Leaders Network for Women's, Children's and Adolescents' Health, President Ramaphosa will gather an esteemed panel of leaders to address how political leadership, investment and partnership can together drive rapid improvements in gender equality, health and well-being, stimulating broad-based social and economic progress guided by the 2030 goals.
